## Chapter IV.—SUMMARY FOR STATES AND INDUSTRIAL AREAS BY INDUSTRIES AND FOR STATES BY CITIES AND COUNTIES (Summary Totals Only)

Since the 1937 statistics do not include data for "Gas, manufactured, illuminating and heating," nor for "Railroad repair shops," the figures for 1935 have been revised by deducting the data for these industries from the totals for States, industrial areas, and for New York City, Chicago, and Philadelphia. No revision has been made for other cities or for counties.

Table 1 of this chapter gives, for each State and the District of Columbia, summary statistics for all industries for which it is possible to publish separate figures without disclosing, exactly or approximately, the data reported by individual establishments. In most cases, however, certain of the "Other industries" (the last item in each State section) are more important than some of the industries for which separate figures are given. (See ch. I, sec. 25).

Table 2 of this chapter contains city and county statistics (summary totals only) by States. These figures are subject to the same method of presentation to prevent the disclosure of the operations of individual manufacturing concerns as are those presented in table 1.

Table 3 contains statistics for 33 industrial areas by industries, arranged in order of relative importance based on number of wage earners reported for 1937. These areas were established in 1929 because of the fact that the area of which an important city is the business and industrial center usually extends some distance beyond the municipal boundaries. Each area includes an important manufacturing city or two or more such cities and comprises the entire county or counties in which the city or cities are located, together with any adjoining county or counties in which there is considerable concentration of manufacturing industry. The manufacturing and printing and publishing industries in each of the industrial areas employed more than 40,000 wage earners in 1929, and more than 30,000 in 1937. The industries in the 33 areas, taken together, accounted for 55.6 percent of all wage earners employed in manufacturing and printing and publishing industries in the United States in 1937. Separate figures are given for each industry, as in table 1, for which it is possible to publish such figures without disclosing, exactly or approximately, any data for individual establishments. Certain of the industries for which combined figures are given ("Other industries"), however, reported larger numbers of wage earners or larger values of products than some of those shown separately. The counties included in each industrial area are shown in table 6, chapter II.
