CONGRESSIONAL ANALYSIS.

In the Senate, yesterday, Mr. Benton from the Committee on Military Affairs, reported a bill repealing the laws establishing brevet rank in the Army, also a bill to increase the number of Assistant Surgeons in the Navy. Mr. Clay's resolution was taken up after the morning business, and Mr. Miller concluded his speech in opposition to it. Mr. Dallas has the floor for this day.

In the House of Representatives, Mr. Clayton submitted a resolution for the appointment of a Select Committee to inquire into the transactions of the Bank of the U. S., with power to send for persons and papers. It was postponed until Monday next. A bill defining the qualifications of voters in the Territory of Arkansas, was passed. The House spent some time in Committee of the Whole on the State of the Union, upon the bill making appropriations for the army for the year 1832, and the general appropriation bill for 1832. Various amendments were adopted, when the Committee rose, reported the bills, and the House adjourned.
