

Mr. Clayton, of Georgia, introduced into one of his speeches against the Bank of the United States, certain charges against the Cashier of the Norfolk Branch, of which he had been acquitted thus—

“BANK, U. S., Dec. 16, 1831.

“At a meeting of the Board of Directors, held this day, the following resolution was, on motion adopted:

“Resolved, That no one of the charges presented by George M’Intosh, against Joseph L. Roberts, Cashier of the Office of this Bank at Norfolk, has been substantiated; nor has any circumstance appeared during the examination, calculated in any degree to diminish the confidence of the Board in the ability and integrity of that Officer.
