Yesterday, the resolution offered by Mr. Foot, to postpone indefinitely the bill on the table, from the House of Representatives, on the subject of Pensions, was, by consent, laid on the table. Mr. Clay presented a petition from farmers of Kentucky, remonstrating against the project of the Secretary of the Treasury on the subject of the Tariff; which was laid on the table.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

The House resolved itself into committee of the whole on the state of the Union, and resumed the consideration of the bill on the Tariff, which was debated at length by Mr. Bates, of Mass., who spoke in favour of the amendment of Mr. Davis, and was followed by Mr. Clayton, of Georgia, in opposition to the constitutionality and expediency of the entire Protecting System.

Mr. Sutherland then obtained the floor, and had not
