

persevering benevolence, with all these qualifications, their support would be doubtful; while the result of that would be certain. But, there is not the remotest probability that, a majority of agents, and sub-agents, would be of the character. Judging from all, past, experience, some of them would be profane, licentious, and overbearing; and a majority would be selfish, looking principally at the emoluments of office and caring little for the Indians.

7. No guarantee of a new country could be given to the Indians, nor pretended guarantee given to either a treaty or a law, or to which they were entitled, at the moment of signing the new act of Congress, which might be repealed whenever Congress should please. Indeed, it is an insult to common sense, to talk of a guarantee, when, supposing half a dozen, or half a score of Indian agents, crowded together on the same frontier, and each of whom, in his secret, might make his separate arrangements, existing, & thus manifestly impossible, however strong this, could easily threaten, insist on their right by treaty signed upon which they had been placed by the United States, when they had previously left the original soil of their ancestors, become Indians, and were and still are obliged to defend their rights. They can never have a title to a new country of equal validity with their title to the soil of their fathers. So they will regard the matter; and we all men will regard it.

8. It may be expected, therefore, that they will hurriedly get settled in their new location, before they will be urged to remain, or to give up the custody of the Indians. If the Indians become garrulous and vagabonds, it will be said, but they may as well be driven beyond the Rocky Mountains at once. If, or, a part of them, should live comfortably, it will prove that white men would live comfortably on the same; and, in a quarter of a century, the population of the United States will be 400,000,000. The Indians will probably be 4,000,000 whites west of the Mississippi.—What then shall those who are more tender of the rights of Indians than the writers of the present day?

SAVAGE HOSTILITIES.

Three days have lately been made, in three cities by parties of whites from Georgia, which will denomininate savagery. After many false alarms have been given of Indian hostilities and savagery, what will the public think of the following, of what we have stated?—A party of whites, eight in number, well armed with guns, in the dead of the night, a few days ago, came into Highpoint and forced their way into a house, kidnapped several, two of whom were negroes, took their money and jewels, and, after shooting their master, also well informed of their master's property, set fire to his house, and then fled. We refer to the letter of George Simonds, and the affidavit of his wife, "our own" in our list. At the time of this occurrence, after from Highpoint, in number, we believe, twelve Indians, had been captured, and were held in confinement, on the part of the nation, with their families. After killing a hog, and doing other infernal acts, some of the Cherokee showed signs of resistance, and, though the savage intruders, who should share recompence for what they had killed, and for other misdeeds, did not do so, the Indians, firmly, in this very place, distinguished the Cherokee forcibly from the rest, and, when they took one of their guns, after they escaped into Georgia. This band of robbers will in all probability, following the example of Stans, have warrants issued against those Cherokee who have had against the hardhanded to stop their inequitable proceedings. It was owing to the absence of the editor, that the above was not first well communicated to the public—we now make them known with out comment.
