

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGIA.—By His Excellency WILSON LUMPKIN, Governor and Commander in Chief of the Army and Navy of this State, and of the Militia thereof.

WHEREAS, I have as directed in and by an act of the General Assembly, passed the 30th day of February, 1833, arranged and counted up the votes given at the elections held throughout the State, on Monday the 12th day December, 1831, pursuant to a Writ of Election issued by the Executive, on 7th day of November last past, for a member to represent this State in the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States, for two years from and after the third day of March, 1831, in the place of Wilson Lumpkin, resigned, from which it appears that Augustin B. Clayton, has the highest number of votes to fill said vacancy. I have therefore thought proper to issue this my proclamation, hereby declaring that the said Augustin B. Clayton, is duly elected a Representative from this State, in the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States for the above mentioned term, and also to notify him the said Augustin B. Clayton, to signify to the Executive his acceptance of said appointment, within the time limited by law, and to produce such proofs of his eligibility, as are required by the act aforesaid.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the seal of the State to be affixed, at the State House in Milledgeville, this third day of January in the year of our Lord 1832, and of American Independence the fifty sixth.
