

In the *House of Representatives*, Mr. ADAMS presented a memorial of certain citizens of the city of New York, in favor of the Cherokee Indians and the missionaries recently imprisoned for disobedience of the laws of the State of Georgia, which he moved to refer to a Select Committee. A debate, which occupied the whole day, ensued, in which Messrs. ADAMS, BELL, WAYNE, CLAYTON, PENDLETON, THOMPSON of Georgia, BEARDSLEY, ELLSWORTH, FOSTER, DICKSON, DRAYTON, DAVIS of Mass., CAMBRELENG, DODDRIDGE, CLAY, BURGESS, STEWART and WARDWELL participated. Mr. THOMPSON of Georgia, moved to lay the memorial on the table, which was rejected—yeas 91, nays 92. The question “will the House commit the petition?” was subsequently agreed to—yeas 96, nays 93. It was finally committed to the same Committee of the Whole on the Union, to which various petitions of a similar character were heretofore committed.
