Which resolution was unanimously adopted. The committee appointed to wait on Mr. Carroll, reported that they had performed that duty, and that Mr. Carroll would receive the members of the Convention at any hour to-day.

Ordered, That the members of this Convention will proceed to visit the venerable Charles Carroll, immediately after the adjournment.

Ordered, That the secretaries cause the journals of the Convention to be signed by the officers of the Convention, and published in pamphlet form for distribution among the members.

On motion of Mr. Burk of Virginia, Resolved, That the thanks of this Convention be presented to the reverend clergy for their attendance upon the Convention.

The Rev. Mr. Wallace then closed the proceeding by an appropriate prayer, and on motion of George Kremer of Pennsylvania, the Convention adjourned, sine die.

GENERAL CONVENTION.

BALTIMORE, Wednesday, May 23, 1832.

9 o'clock, A. M.—The Convention met pursuant to adjournment—and was opened with prayer by the Rev. Mr. Burk.

Mr. Archer of Virginia, from the committee on the subject of an address to the people, made the following report:

The committee to whom was assigned the duty of preparing an address from this Convention to the people of the United States, Report,

That having interchanged opinions on the subject submitted to them, and agreeing fully in the principles and sentiments which they believe ought to be embodied in an address of this description, if such an address were to be made, nevertheless deem it advisable, under existing circumstances, to recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That it be recommended to the several delegations in this Convention, in place of a general address from this body to the people of the United States, to make such explanations by address, report or otherwise, to their respective constituents of the objects, proceedings and result of the meeting as they may deem expedient.

Which report and resolution were read and adopted unanimously.
