

DINNER TO JUDGE CLAYTON.

By the Greenville Southern Sentinel, of the 8th ult., received last night, we perceive that the citizens of Laurens District, South Carolina, gave a public dinner to Judge A. S. Clayton, of Georgia, on Wednesday, the 25th ult. Judge Clayton addressed the assembly (which is variously estimated at from twelve to fifteen hundred persons,) on the all absorbing subject of the tariff; and strongly advocated the doctrine of nullification. In concluding, he said: "You will naturally inquire what is to be done? Submit? Certainly not. No freeman will submit to it. I advise, then, the most peaceful remedy, and strange as to some it may seem, I advise NULLIFICATION."

He then gave the following toast: *The late Tariff Act*—It is now a plain case—LIBERTY or SUBMISSION! He that dallies is a dastard, he that doubts is damned!
