Dinner to Judge Clayton.—By the Greenville *Southern Sentinel*, of the 23th ult. received last night, we perceive that the citizens of Laurens District, South Carolina, gave a public dinner to Judge A. S. CLAYTON of Georgia, on Wednesday, the 23th ult. Judge Clayton addressed the assembly (which is variously estimated at from 12 to 1500 persons,) on the all absorbing subject of the Tariff; and strongly advocated the doctrine of Nullification. In concluding he said: "You will naturally inquire, what is to be done? Submit? certainly not. No freeman will submit to it! I advise, then, the most peaceful remedy, and strange as to some it may seem, I advise **NULLIFICATION!**"

He then gave the following toast:—"The late Tariff Act.—It is now a plain case—**LIBERTY or SUBMISSION!** He that dallies is a Dastard—he that doubts is damned!"
