

Dinner to Judge Clayton.

By the Greenville Southern Sentinel of 26th ult. we perceive that the citizens of Laurens District, S. Carolina, gave a public dinner to Judge A. S. Clayton of Georgia, on Wednesday the 25:h ult. Judge Clayton addressed the assembly (which is variously estimated at from 12 to 1500 persons.) on the all-absorbing subject of the Tariff, and strongly advocated the doctrine of nullification. In concluding he said: "You will naturally inquire, what is to be done? Submit? Certainly not. No free-man will submit to it. I advise then, the most peaceful remedy, and, strange as to some it may seem, I advise **NULLIFICATION.**"

He then gave the following toast:
