By the Greenville Southern Sentinel of 28th ult. we perceive that the citizens of Laurens District, S. Carolina, gave a public dinner to Judge A. S. Clayton of Georgia, on Wednesday the 25th ult. Judge Clayton addressed the assembly (which is variously estimated at from 12 to 1500 persons.) on the all-absorbing subject of the Tariff, and strongly advocated the doctrine of nullification. In concluding he said: "You will naturally inquire, what is to be done? Submit? Certainly not. No freeman will submit to it. I advise then, the most peaceful remedy, and, strange as to some it may seem, I advise NTLLIFICA-He then gave the following toast: The late Tariff Act-It is now a plain case-Liberty or Submission! He that dallies is a dastard; he that doubts is damned.
