By Dr. J. B. Randall : A. S. Clayton : He has displayed in defence of Southern rights, the honesty of a Cincinnatus, and the firmness of a Regulus, with a power of eloquence, which carries conviction home even to his enemies. After the applause of the above sentiment had subsided, P. H. Echols, Esq. arose and addressed the company a few minutes, in a most eloquent, patriotic and forcible manner, in support of the doctrines of State rights and the 'rightful remody,' so triumphantly sustained in the letter of Judge Clayion, which he then proceeded to read, and which we hope to be permitted to lay before the public. At the conclusion of his letter, Judge Clayton gives the following sentiment : Nullification: The rightful remedy: If its secret friends were as bold as its open enemies, they would escape much of their insolent and malignant revilinos.
