

The legislative proceedings of the past week, of a general nature, are submitted.—The charges preferred against Judge Fort of the Southern circuit, will, it is expected, should they result in an impeachment, occupy the attention of the house to a later period than is usual. The different reports of the committee on the state of the republic, have been made and agreed to. The one on the Tariff and Internal Improvement, and also that on the differences between the State and General Government, from the pen of Judge Clayton, from the ability with which they are written, are clear and satisfactory. Another, by Judge Shorter, on the right of Georgia to the Cherokee lands, is cogent and conclusive. The extension of the civil jurisdiction of the state over the Cherokee territory, was made the order of the day for Wednesday last.
