"THE CHEROKEE PHŒNIX."-This is the title of a newspaper proposed to be published by Elias Boudinot in the Cherokee nation, for the benefit of the people thereof—in part to be printed in English, and in part with the lately invented Cherokee characters—matters of interest to be inserted in parallel columns: to issue weekly, at \$2 50 per annum, if paid in advance. The design of it is to spread, and preserve, the laws of the nation and its public documents; and furnish accounts of its manners, customs, education, religion, &c.; and promote a love of literature in this people. We heartily wish success to this project. Whether it be the Cherokees, or any other nation, we are nearly indifferent-but we have long wished that some one tribe might be incorporated into the family of the republic—as proof to posterity that extermination was not the desire of the generation in which Washington lived and Jefferson flourished, however much it has resulted from the march of the white population, and, perhaps, generally must.—Niles' Register.
