

*Congressional.*—In the House of Representatives, January 12th, the following resolution, submitted on the 5th inst. by Mr. LUMPKIN, was adopted :

*Resolved,* That the President of the United States be requested to cause to be laid before this House (if it should not be deemed incompatible with the public interest) such information as will clearly exhibit what has been done under the act of the 9th May last, appropriating fifty thousand dollars, to enable the President of the United States, to carry into effect the articles of agreement and session of the 24th April, 1802, between the United States and the State of Georgia. And also, what has been done with a view to promote the aforesaid object, as provided for and pointed out in the 5th article of the treaty of May last, entered into with the Cherokee Indians who reside west of the Missouri River.

And especially, what number of Indians (located within the boundary of Georgia) have accepted of the provisions of said treaty, as contained in the aforesaid article, and what are the principal obstacles which tend to prevent the Indians located in Georgia from acceding to the terms proposed to them in said treaty.
