

*Cherokee Territory.*—Information has been received by the Executive, from one of the commissioners, Col. Wales, lately appointed to repair to the Cherokee territory, and obtain testimony respecting the line formerly dividing the Creeks and Cherokees, that he was collecting all the testimony he could, and that he had no doubt it would prove satisfactory to the General Government, whose decision cannot be adverse to the claim of Georgia. The Georgia commissioners were at the Cherokee Agency, on the 26th Nov. so was Gen. Coffee, the commissioner appointed by the President of the U. S. to ascertain the true boundary line between the Creeks and Cherokees. It appears, from the communication of Col. Wales to the Executive, that he, and Mr. Gates, may return from their mission before the adjournment of the legislature; we may then be informed of the testimony Gen. Coffee will have collected, and the opinion he has formed respecting the boundary line.—*Jour.*
