

Col. Crowell, Indian Agent, left his agency on the 23th ult. accompanied by Benjamin Marshal, a half-breed chief of the Creek tribe, for Washington City. The object of their visit, it is said, is to establish, more to the satisfaction of the Indians, the boundary line between the Creeks and Cherokees west of the Mississippi, and to learn more fully the views of the government in relation to emigration. In another part of this paper will be found the talk of Joseph Marshal another of this family, to the Creeks, on his return from the Arkansas, whither he had gone to explore the territory, and learn the quality of the land, the salubrity of the climate, and the condition of the people.
