

Since writing the foregoing remarks, we have read the decision of the Convention of Judges in the case of the State vs. George Tassels. Our readers will recollect that at the last Superior Court of Hall County, a Cherokee Indian was arraigned for the murder of another Indian—Judge Clayton presiding. The prisoner's counsel objected to the jurisdiction of the court, and this question was referred by Judge Clayton to the Convention of Judges. The convention consisted of Judges Crawford, Colquitt, W. W. Holt, Strong and Lamar—Judge Law was not present, but concurred in their decision. The convention recognise the right of the State of Georgia to jurisdiction over the Indians—the arguments are forcible, and present several facts that will throw much additional light on the subject.
