

TO MECHANICS.

PROPOSALS will be received by the Prudential Committee until the first Monday in April next, to rebuild the College Edifice lately burnt down, at Athens. And to the end that Mechanics may know what is required to be done, we invite them to an inspection of the present ruin, and to a further communication with the Committee on any subject connected with the above object. In the first place it must be understood, that the propositions made, will not be binding, either to the proposer or the Committee, as the same will have to be laid before a full meeting of the Board of Trustees at the time aforesaid, subject to their ratification or such alterations as they may be pleased to make. With this understanding, it is requested that the proposer will state the lowest sum for which he will restore the Edifice to its former situation in *all respects*. Then what deductions will be made, 1st for omitting the mantle peices, which before were of the same kind of those in the old College. 2d. For changing the Pannel into batton doors. 3d. For omitting the small bed rooms attached to the sitting rooms. 4th. For omitting one of the closets in the jams of the chimnies, and 5th. what difference will be made in the ceiling or plastering ever head. The Edifice it is expected will be re'built as strong as it was before, and in a workmanlike manner, and to this end, when the building is finally let, bond and security will be required. As the building is much wanted, the shortness of time in which it will be completed, will be a great object in deciding on propositions. The payments required must also be stated.
