

UNITED STATES BANK.—The Savannah Georgian informs us, that the citizens of Macon have applied to the Bank of the United States, for the establishment of a branch in that place; and that a branch has recently been established in Burlington, Vermont.

We must have erred greatly to believe that there was [in] the State, a sufficient number of banks. There are now in operation eighteen local banks and branches, exclusive of the branch of the United States Bank; and the citizens of Macon find that another is needed. Well; we have no objection to the establishment of a branch of the United States Bank at that place; we would willingly give our consent, for a branch of that bank to be established in every town of the State: the people would perhaps have their eyes opened the sooner to the mischief produced by over banking, and to the danger of extending the power and influence of such a moneyed institution as the Bank of the United States, with a capital of \$35,000,000, and the privilege of handling the whole revenue of the United States, amounting to about \$25,000,000 annually.
