

*Creek Line.*—General Coffee, in a letter from Nashville of the — requests from the Governor of this State, all the information in his possession which may throw any light on the subject of the true boundary line between the Creek and Cherokee Nations of Indians, relative to which there is a difference of opinion between the State of Georgia and the Cherokees. The General states, that having been appointed by the United States to perform the duty of collecting testimony relative to this line, he expected to leave his residence near Florance, Alabama, on the 16th ult. and to arrive at the Cherokee Agency about the 22d. It appears from this therefore, that the General Government intend to act with their accustomed promptitude in this matter. We trust that the question will soon be amicably and satisfactorily settled.
